You sell products to European countries outside Germany? Internationally operating companies must fulfil their takeback obligations in accordance with the legislation in force in the respective country.

In some countries, the appointment of an authorised representative and packaging labels are mandatory.

What is currently happening in these countries

In **France**, companies that place household packaging on the market have had to submit a prevention plan to reduce their environmental impact since 2023, which must be revised every 5 years. In addition, since 2022, manufacturers and distributors must apply the "Triman" logo to all products, packaging and WEEE in order to be compliant on the market. The logo informs private consumers about sorting instructions.

In **Austria**, foreign companies without a registered office in Austria have been obliged to appoint an authorised representative based in Austria for packaging since 2023.

In **Spain**, foreign distributors of packaging have had to register with the Ministry of the Environment since 2023, report on packaging placed on the market and appoint an authorised representative. For household packaging, manufacturers must report their quantities to the disposal service provider. There are no free or minimum quantities. From 2025, the licensing obligation will be extended to commercial and industrial packaging. The EPR systems must be in place by the end of 2024.

Since January 2024, all companies that place packaging on the **Finnish** market have been required to register, regardless of their turnover. With the abolition of the turnover threshold of one million euros at the beginning of the year, Finland is now making significantly more companies responsible for contributing to the costs of recycling their packaging.

From 1 July 2025, the extended producer responsibility responsibility (EPR) for packaging comes into force in **Denmark**. However, companies that place packaging on the Danish market must take action before then: As distributors, these companies are obliged to to register in the DPA producer register and report their quantities between 1 April and 1 September 2024.
