This emblem was developed for labelling recyclable packaging. After a scientifically based packaging analysis by Interzero and the determination of good or very good recyclability of the packaging, it is possible to use the seal.

Printing **always should be done in the colours** Interzero-blue and Interzero-cyan (for colours please see below). If it is not possible to print in colour, the label is printed in black/white. In exceptional cases, the sign can also be embossed or branded. Digital templates are available for the colour variants.

The **primary colours white and Interzero-blue** shape the appearance, and their use should be predominant when designing any and all media. White should primarily be used as the colour for fields, and Interzero-blue should be used as the colour for text.

The **secondary colours Interzero-cyan and Interzero-yellow** should be used for accents. Interzero-cyan is used as a distinctive colour in typography and in diagrams and can be used over large areas for organising topics. Interzero-yellow is chiefly for use in graphics and eye-catchers.

Shades of black complete the range of colours. These colours can be used for subordinate text, e.g. for page numbers, multilingual texts, within diagrams and tables.
